

Research on the Application of Ruyi Patterns in Modern China Chic Fashion Design

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ABSTRACT




practical references for the modernization transformation of Chinese traditional patterns, while injecting new vitality into the cultural depth and innovation of China Chic fashion design.



2.3 Artistic Characteristics of Ruyi Patterns

2.3.1 Aesthetic of Ruyi Shapes
